This newsletter provides a brief update of the key wholesale electricity market design changes currently being progressed within Great Britain, focusing on September 2007.

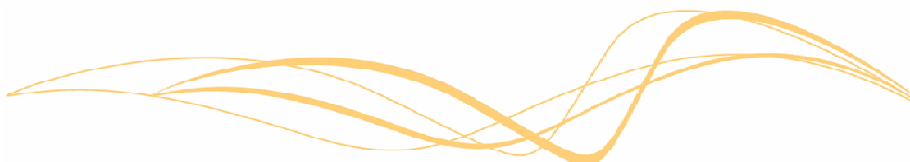

A number of other consultations/decisions that may be relevant are also noted.

This issue covers: Ofgem consultations; publications/announcements by a number of government and other bodies; the EU Emissions Trading Scheme; consultations and reports by National Grid (NGET), and new BSC and CUSC Modifications, decisions, and related matters. This edition also identifies press releases from the EU that may be relevant to the British electricity wholesale sector.

### Issue: Ofgem's thoughts on reform of the RO

Ofgem has published its response to BERR's consultation on reform of the Renewables Obligation which covers Ofgem's views on alternative approaches as well as the specific issues raised in the consultation. Points of interest include:

- Ofgem states that the banding proposals, which it sees as attempting to select technologies, could have a detrimental effect on consumers;
- Ofgem considers that other schemes or policies

could have delivered the same, or greater, emissions reductions at lower cost;

- Ofgem notes that EU comparisons indicate that feed in tariffs are more cost effective than quota based schemes such as the RO;
- Ofgem suggest that the cost to domestic customers will rise from £8/yr to £28/year (nominal) by 2015/16 and that the banding proposals will increase the overall cost to customers;
- Ofgem suggest that the proposed 1.5ROCs/MWh is higher than needed for post demonstration technologies and the 2ROCs/MWh for the emerging technologies band will be too low (without additional support via a different route);
- Ofgem also support a separate microgeneration band to ease the administrative burden for this sector (which is currently banded within the relevant technology on shore band such that micro PV and micro wind are in different bands) or allowing Ofgem to issue ROCs based on the dominant technology on multi technology/band premises;
- Ofgem believes BERR should consider alternatives to the RO including the approach it proposed in January (based on firm CfDs) and feed in tariffs and different reforms to the RO “to make it more effective” such as using the buy out fund to grant programmes (for renewables or CCS or to tackle fuel poverty) rather than recycling it;
- Ofgem note the additional complexities of banding and grandfathering and anticipate this will lead to reduced transparency and more queries; and
- Ofgem note that the changes will lead to higher admin costs (£0.5m set up costs and £0.2m/year operational) and support recovering these costs from the buy-out fund rather than licence fees.

Ofgem has published an open letter indicating that the Authority will not be in a position to publish its final decisions on the zonal losses modifications this month, as indicated in its “minded to” statement in June 2007.

The letter gives Ofgem’s reasoning for this delay and indicates that it has been requested, by the Authority, to review analysis undertaken by Osera in order to reassess the validity of the conclusions that may be drawn from that analysis. The letter also states that “Ofgem will consider whether to appoint consultants to assist in this review and would expect to consult on the findings of the review” and that the “Authority will take the findings of the review and responses to the proposed consultation into account in making its final decisions”.

In light of this, a decision is now anticipated in Spring 2008 and the Authority has suggested that the BSC Panel should propose an alternative implementation date consistent with this. The letter also states that, should the Authority decide to approve any of the proposals, it would consult with affected parties before directing an alternative implementation date.

Ofgem has published National Grid’s winter outlook for Winter 2007/08. The letter states that forecast margins, for electricity, are expected to remain manageable even under severe weather conditions. At current market prices (including higher carbon prices

under EU ETS Phase 2 from January 2008), coal is expected to remain baseload over winter 2007/8.

The letter also summarises the responses to Ofgem’s consultation on the guidance and Ofgem’s response.

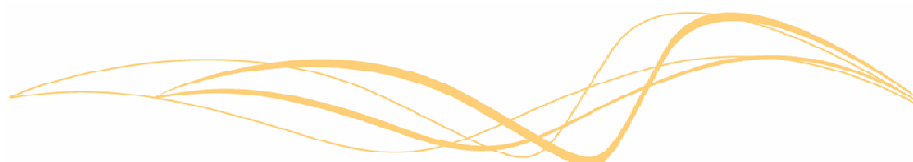

DEFRA has published a paper that sets out the options the UK Government could propose as part of the development of the EU ETS. The paper states that its purpose is to promote discussion within Government and with stakeholders by identifying the issues and listing the pros and cons of different approaches (in tabular form) rather than setting out Government policy.

The paper covers six areas

- cap-setting;
- allocation methodology;
- expanding the scope of the EU ETS;
- harmonising the current scope of the scheme;
- linking to other trading schemes; and
- monitoring, reporting and verification (MRV).

The Scottish Executive has issued a statutory consultation on changes to the Renewables Obligation Order in Scotland to set the level of the MSO for 2008/9 at zero with “illustrative” values for subsequent years. It is accompanied by a document that describes the process to be followed for setting the MSO in subsequent years.

The consultation also seeks views on whether BERR's banding proposals should be introduced under the

ROS noting that any decision to introduce banding would be subject to separate and detailed consultation with stakeholders in Scotland.

The consultation indicates that the SE considers banding could take over from the MSO but that, currently, there is insufficient detail on the level of support that will be available.

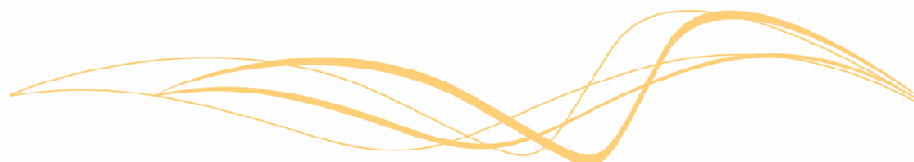

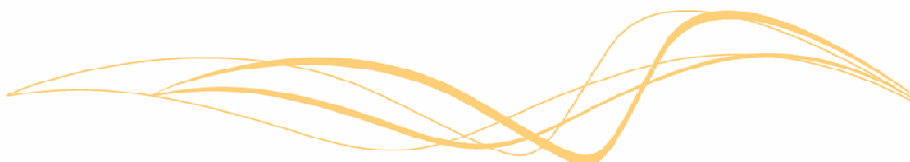
## IPA NEWS

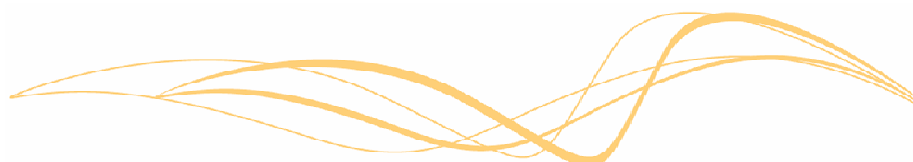

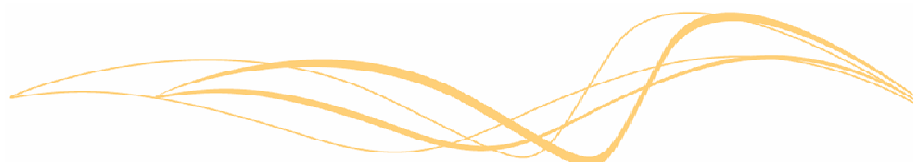

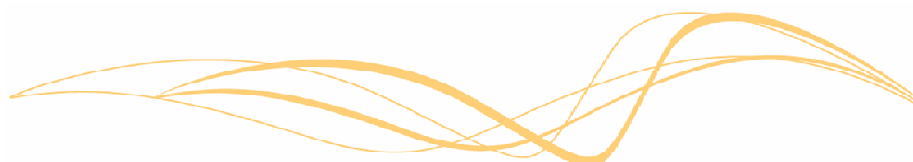
